- Describe experiences, events, dreams, and ambitions.
- Write emails, letters, and short essays with organized ideas and proper structure.
- Expand vocabulary related to common everyday situations.
- Develop a wider range of grammatical structures, tenses, and connectors.
- Use vocabulary and grammar accurately to convey meaning effectively.
